- Use DiscoverEd to find the shelfmark.
- Make a note of the shelf mark and find the location in the library using the Stack and Bay guides.
- Go to the Stack which has the shelfmark sequence and refer to the Stack Guide to find the Bay Number.
- Journals are held in the Law Library and Library Annexe use DiscoverEd or ask for assistance at the Helpdesk to find location.


