How do I find Library resources?

The Library provides access to a wide range of resources including, books, e-books, print and e-journals and databases. The Library has an e-preference policy which means that many of the books we buy are e-books and many of the resources you need for your study and research are available online.

DiscoverEd

DiscoverEd is the Library's discovery service. Use it to search the Library's collections: this includes books, e-books, journal titles, journal articles, databases and more. Use University login details to sign into your Library Account and manage loans, requests and fines. To access MyEd and electronic resources use your University login details.

Study space

- Study space is available for undergraduates, postgraduates, staff and external users.
- Workspaces and PCs are available on the ground, first and second floor.
- PC availability can be checked online.
- All workspaces have access to desktop power and USB charging points.
- Two group study rooms are available for students to book and are located on the 2nd floor balcony. The rooms each seat 8 people and are equipped with PCs.
 These rooms can be booked via MyEd.
- The University WiFi service, eduroam, is available throughout the Library.

PCs are also available at:

- Thomson's Land in rooms G.06, 1.12, and 1.14 (Macs only).
- Room 2.36 on second floor of St. Leonard's Land.

Please note these rooms are occasionally used for teaching, so availability is not always guaranteed.

An open access PC lab is available nearby at High School Yards within the Institute of Geography building.

Borrowing information

Staff and Postgraduate Research students may borrow 60 items, Postgraduate Taught students 50 items and Undergraduates 30 items. Alumni can borrow 15 items and external users 5 items. Reserve books can only be borrowed by University of Edinburgh staff and students, and only 3 may be borrowed at any one time.

Loan Periods/Fines

	Loan period	Overdue fines	Maximum renewal period**
Standard loan	4 weeks*	20p per day	6 months
Short loan	1 week	40p per day	4 months
Reserve	3 hours	2p per minute	No renewals

- Staff and Postgraduate standard loan period is 12 weeks with a maximun renewal period of 18 months.
- ** Unless you have fines over £10 or the item has been recalled by another use

Items can be renewed by accessing the My Account tab on DiscoverEd. If items cannot be renewed online, please contact the Moray House Library Helpdesk.

Standard and short loan books that are out on loan or held in the University Collections Facility (UCF) can be requested through DiscoverEd.

The fine for overdue recalled items is £1 per day.





About us

Moray House Library is located within the Holyrood Campus of the University of Edinburgh School of Education, just off the historic Royal Mile.

The library is on three levels in Dalhousie Land Building, and houses an extensive collection of books and journals mainly on the subject of Education, with specialities in School Education, Teaching English as a Second Language and Sport and Physical Education.

Moray House Library also houses a Special Collections section, which is a useful resource for research on the history of Scottish education. This includes publications on the history of individual Scottish schools, Scottish educational policy, and Scottish Education Reports from 1841 to 1978.

The library offers 141 spaces and 2 group study rooms in a designated silent study space with access to Wifi.
