Include material not found in DiscoverEd or Google Scholar. Contain details of millions of articles from 1000s of publications.










7 Search History function


Investigate the differences changes to search terms and their combinations make.

Direct import of records from databases.


Group records and attach files to them.

Cite while you write in Word.


Export chosen references in BibTeX format.

EndNote desktop for free (not Schools of Informatics, Maths or Physics)




