- May have political bias
- They can provide rapid reporting
- Reflect opinion and attitudes



Newspapers, magazines and other news sources

The University has access to an extensive range of online databases that allow you to search, browse and view newspapers, magazines and other news sources. This includes both historic and current material.

The Library also holds small collections of newspapers in print or on microfilm. More information can be found in the relevant section above.

Newspapers, magazines and other news sources at the Library

Newspapers and magazines are a useful to find out about key events, people and places.

Most newspapers and magazines are written for the general public or specific groups of the general public. As well as **news stories**, **interviews** and **features** they include **opinion pieces** (from writers, editors or members of the public i.e. Letters to the Editor), **obituaries** and **ephemera** (advertisements, court circulars, weather reports, etc.,). Larger, national newspapers will also sometimes provide battle or war reports, law or court reports and parliamentary reports, including reproductions of speeches.



Traditional print newspapers and magazines are not the only place you can find news though. TV, radio, film, websites, etc., can also be used as news sources

Things to consider

Newspapers, magazines and other news sources can be be valuable to your research as they can provide up to date coverage of events, news and opinion, include images and can include reliable information as well as facts and figures.

However, when using any news source in your research there are things you need to consider:

What are periodicals?

Periodicals are publications that are published at regular intervals e.g. daily, weekly, monthly, etc. Newspapers and magazines are periodicals, as well as newsletters, scholarly journals, etc.


In the Main Library our print journals have shelfmarks starting PER.

TV and other news sources

The databases on this page will allow you to search for and view TV news, newsreels, films, documentaries, radio programmes, etc. In some cases they will also provide transcripts and subtitles.

These databases don't have as many advanced search features as the newspaper and magazine databases, searching can be a bit more basic.



Box of Broadcasts (BoB)

BoB is an on demand TV and radio service for education. It allows you to search an archive of over 2 million broadcasts, recorded programmes from over 65 free-to-air channels, and create your own playlists, clips, etc. Content includes BBC One, BBC Two, BBC Four, ITV, Channel 4, BBC News, CNN, Sky News, etc.

To sign in search for and choose, University of Edinburgh. The first time you sign in you will be asked to provide your university email address. Access is restricted to UK mainland only. Use of VPN might help you get around this.

Academic Video Online



Academic Video Online is a multidisciplinary collection of videos that touches on a wide range of subject areas. With tens of thousands of titles available now and 400 new titles per month, this collection is unmatched in its breadth. Includes historical newsreels from producers such as Universal Pictures and United Newsreels. Also includes new programmes from CNN, CBS, Bloomberg, etc.



News on Screen (from BUFVC)

A resource for the study of news reels and cinemagazines (1910-1983) complete with Pathe film clips where they exist.

Some resources on BUFVC require sign in - click sign in, enter "University of Edinburgh" in the search box and if prompted sign in with your EASE username and password.



FACTIVA®


- Has over 30,000 sources including newspapers and news sources
- Covers both UK and international newspapers: The Times, El Pais, China Daily
- Read today's edition but also search through previous editions (up to 30 years back for some titles).




- Has over 10,000 full text publications including newspapers and news sources
- Covers both UK and international newspapers


Nexis*

- Covers UK and international newspapers and news sources
 - Similar to Factiva in that it also covers business sources, financial and market reports, company info, etc.
- Coverage similar to Factiva also, most sources from early 1980s onwards
 - Does have some titles Factiva doesn't e.g. Le Monde





Going Further

- Gale Digital Scholar Lab create and analyse datasets for sources, including British Library Newspapers.
 - Tools included are Ngram, Topic Modelling (Mallet), Named Entity Recognition, Clustering (SciKit) and Term Frequencies (Lucene).
- Webscraping news sites
- Text analysis (Python, R, ...) caution download restrictions
- Sentiment (can add this to Factiva searches)


