MANTRA - The Research Data Management Training Course

What is it?

MANTRA is a free, non-credit online course which provides guidelines for good practice in research data management.

It consists of interactive online units which focus on key concepts of data management. They feature video clips of academics and PhD students talking about the challenges of managing their research data.

The units are accompanied by practical exercises in handling data within four software analysis environments (**SPSS**, **NVivo, R and ArcGIS**), which learners can download and work through at their own pace.

What is it?

It is for PhD students, early career researchers, and all others who are planning a research project. The course is an Open Educational Resource that may be freely used by anyone. It is available through an open license for re-using, rebranding, and repurposing.

Who produced it?

The Data Library team at EDINA produced the original materials during the MANTRA project (2010-11), part of the JISC Managing Research Data programme They worked with the School of Social and Political Science, the School of GeoSciences and the Clinical Psychology section in the School of Health in Social Science to target the resources towards their doctoral training programmes. The software practicals were written by expert data analysts in each software domain. The online module was created using Xerte Online Toolkits, an open source authoring tool.
