

## How to apply a CC licence on SoundCloud

In this document we describe how to apply a Creative Commons licence to content on SoundCloud.

### Creative Commons Licences on SoundCloud

SoundCloud has an [excellent primer on Creative Commons](#), which gives you all the info you need to know about [uploading and licensing music](#) on their platform.

You must be registered and logged into your account to upload files to SoundCloud.

You can 1) choose a CC licence when [uploading a track or set](#) or 2) change your default license setting in your [‘extra settings’](#).

### Option 1

After registering an account, select ‘Upload & Share’ from the top menu, or go to <http://soundcloud.com/upload>. Upload your track or set. Then select the CC licence:
