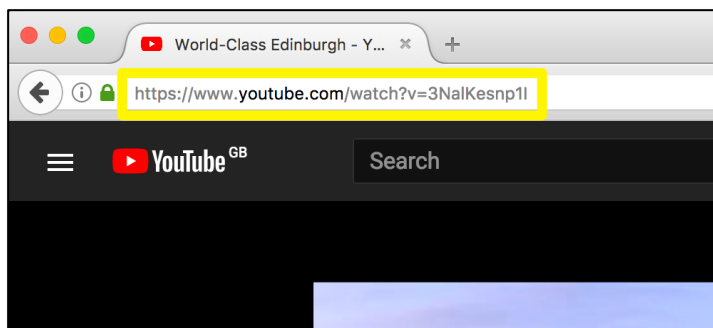
Adding YouTube videos to My Media

Media Hopper Create allows you to import metadata from YouTube videos so that they can be searched for and viewed within Media Hopper Create. Importing from YouTube is useful if you want to make media more visible or let YouTube do the heavy lifting for content that will get a lot of views (e.g. videos used in a MOOC). Imported YouTube content is effectively streamed from YouTube through Media Hopper Create.

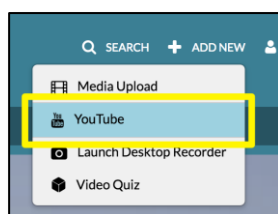
Only videos which have a Public privacy level within YouTube can be imported into Media Hopper Create. Imported YouTube videos cannot be added to new or existing Media Hopper Create playlists.

All you need to import a video from YouTube is the video's URL.


1. Browse for and open the video in YouTube that you would like to import into Media Hopper Create.
2. Single click inside the **Address bar** to highlight the video's URL. Right click and select **Copy** or use **Ctrl+C** to copy the video link.



3. Open the **Media Hopper Create portal** (www.media.ed.ac.uk) and log in to your account (click on **Guest** and choose **Login**).
4. Click on the **Add New** button and select **YouTube**.



- When the **YouTube** page loads, click inside the **Video Page Link** box and press **Ctrl+V** to paste the copied video URL.





- Once you've completed the fields, select a suitable privacy setting (Private, Unlisted or Published). Click **Save** to import the video.

Unlisted - Media page will be visible to anyone with a link to the page.

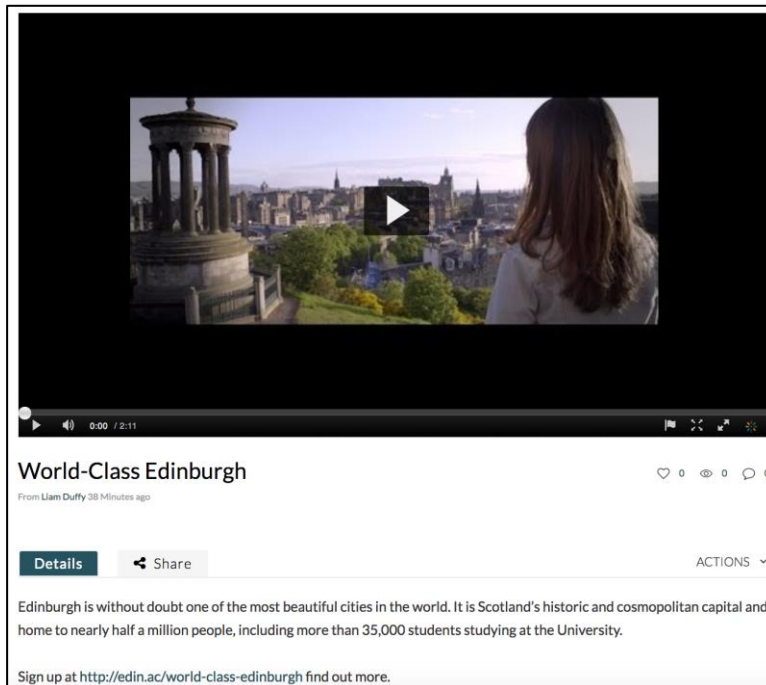
Published - Media page will be visible to individuals according to entitlements on published destinations

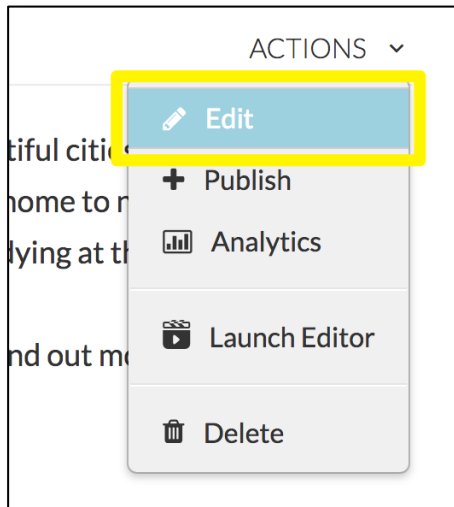
9. Once the video has been imported, you'll be informed it has been successfully uploaded. Click on the **Go To Media** button to view your video.
